P

Prioritised investment in prevention, early intervention, tackling health inequalities, and recovery in physical and mental health so that people can live better for longer.



E

Enabled the NHS to ensure that more care and support is quickly available in people's homes, communities, and hospitals when they need it, and that no one has to wait for lengthy periods for appointments, diagnostics, and treatment and care.



R

Realised a genuine cross-government approach that harnesses the life-enhancing potential of paediatric and children's services, general practice, adult social care, the voluntary sector, housing, peer support, and advice.



S

Supported local systems to reorientate how care and support is delivered so that more physical and mental health support is available earlier and prevents premature deterioration.



O

Optimised how technology, data, medicines, genomics, and other innovations are deployed.



N

Nurtured, supported, recruited, retained, and trained people to deliver 21<sup>st</sup> century care across all care settings.
